
This week in PE, KS1 have been continuing their focus on throwing and catching.

Mealtime Support Week 3



Some children struggle with the sensory aspects of certain food types and will avoid the food they find overwhelming.

Sensory triggers can involve appearance (colour or shape), texture, smell and taste. Selective eating is not always a problem. Everyone has preferences, your child may exclude specific food but still have a balanced diet!

Eating is an experience which involves all our senses. It is important to understand that we all process sensory information differently. What smells good to one person can be unpleasant to others. What feels comfortably warm to some may feel too hot for others.

Children who refuse foods or have a very restricted diet are dealing with a lot of information. However, for some children, there appears not to be a sensory element restricting their diet, and it is their dislike of change and preference for sameness that can contributes to issues around food.

RECIPE OF THE WEEK

Logan and Freya from year 5, have already polished up their culinary skills and attempted the recipe below. They sold their cake at Bluebells cake sale last Friday.

CHOCOLATE AND COURGETTE CAKE

Ingredient

For the cake

- 4 medium eggs, beaten
- 150ml vegetable oil
- o 130ml semi-skimmed milk
- o 300g light brown soft sugar
- 350g plain flour
- o 75g cocoa powder, plus extra for dusting
- 2 tsp baking powder
- o 400g courgettes
- 1 tsp vanilla extract



For the icing

- 100g unsalted butter, softened
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 250g icing sugar

Method

Step 1


Preheat the oven to 190°C/gas mark 5. Line a 20cm x 30cm baking tray with baking parchment.

Step 2

Whisk together the eggs, oil and milk. Add the brown sugar and mix well. Sift the flour, cocoa and baking powder into a bowl, then fold into the wet mixture. Finely grate the courgettes and stir into the mixture along with 1 tsp vanilla extract. Spoon into the baking tray and bake for 40 minutes, then leave to cool.

Step 3

Meanwhile, beat the butter, vanilla extract and 250g icing sugar in a bowl. Spread the icing over the top of the cooled cake and finish with a dusting of cocoa. Cut into slices, remove from the tray and serve.


