Dear families,

Today at 4pm, you will be receiving the first half of your child's annual school report. To remind you how our reporting processes in the Sunflower Federation work:

- We break our end of year report into two halves, the first half will be with you today, and specifically reports on pupils behaviour, attitudes to learning and outcomes in Reading, Writing and Maths at this point in the year. We also set targets for the rest of the year.

- This is quickly followed by a parent consultation meeting opportunity, with additional time given in this meeting for those children who have SEND and therefore extra time to talk about their APDR documents. You should have been able to book one of these appointments using the sign up form.

- These parent consultations begin in the week commencing 18th March 2024 for each school, and take up to two weeks to fully complete. The focus of these meetings will be the first half of the school report that you will have received today. Any questions you have from the school report, please bring up in this consultation meeting with your child's class teacher.

We offer similar in the summer term with the second half of the school report, which this year will arrive in late June / early July and be slightly different based on previous year's feedback, to give families time to talk with their child's class teacher following the publication of this report.
We split our reports in two halves to make teacher workload lighter, and to enable children to work towards their mid-year targets, rather than just receive these at the end of the school year.



# Week 13 Norfolk Positive Behaviour Strategies (PBS)

Positive Behaviour Strategies (PBS) is a programme for families of children with additional needs produced by our partners in Norfolk Community Health and Care and Family Action

During the course you will hear the term neurodevelopmental disorder which refers to conditions such as autism (autistic spectrum disorder, ASD), and attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD). It is really important to remember that having a name for your child's condition does not alter how your child behaves.

This course will help you think about the messages your child is trying to communicate to you and some practical skills and strategies to help you manage your child in a positive way.

# RECIPE OF THE WEEK

Another firm favorite in the dinner hall....Jammy swirls!! Easy to make and quick for a weekend pudding, serve with ice cream, custard or just simply delicous on its own.

## JAMMY SWIRLS

6



Ingredients

- Frozen puff pastry sheets
- jam of any kind
- cinnamon and sugar mix



#### Instructions

- Preheat your oven to 200 degrees Celsius and pop some baking paper on a large tray.
- Separate your puff pastry sheets and let them defrost for a little while. One sheet makes about 20-22 swirls so only defrost as many as you need.
- Once defrosted, spread the pastry with the jam of your choosing and sprinkle on lots of cinnamon sugar.
- Roll up your jammy, cinnamon-ey, pastry into a long scroll, try to keep the scroll as tightly rolled as you can.
- Slice of sections of scroll with a sharp knife, about 1cm thick and place them on the tray.
- Pop the tray into the oven for 10-15 minutes or until the scrolls have puffed up and turned a golden brown.
- While still hot sprinkle with a little more cinnamon sugar and eat them while they are still warm!




